Abstract:

Modern *Generative Linguistics* has around a 70 year history with roots going further back; for example, Chomsky, in particular, has cited Einstein, von Humboldt, Descartes, and Galileo as inspiration. In contrast, *Generative AI* has come firmly to the fore only recently, but has its roots in classic machine learning. As human language has been a focus of Generative AI, the success of largely-opaque *Large Language Models* (LLMs) have led some, such as Piantadosi, Futrell & Mahowald and Hinton, to pit AI against Generative Linguistics. In the first part of this talk, I will discuss the considerable impact of Generative AI, review these claims against Generative Linguistics, and also explain relevant aspects of the inner workings of LLMs.
